The American Healthcare Act: The Republican Answer to Obamacare

The Republicans have finally released their answer to Obamacare and it is mostly *keep and repeal*, very little *replace*. Almost everything that Americans liked about Obamacare has been kept: children can still stay on their parents plan until age 26; one still can't be denied coverage for pre-existing conditions and there is still no lifetime maximum on what insurance companies must pay for care.

However, everything the Republicans hated has been repealed: gone are the subsidies that made insurance affordable for the poor, replaced by tax credits, based not on financial need but on age (The older you are, the more you get!); Medicaid expansion goes away in 2020 and Federal funding to the states will change dramatically. Some large employers will no longer be required to provide an employee health insurance benefit. This is how over 60% of Americans currently get healthcare coverage. Also gone are all of the taxes and penalties that provided funding for the programs in Obamacare. The bill prohibits Medicaid payments to Planned Parenthood clinics for one year, starting the date the bill is enacted. This effectively eliminates a significant source of care for low income individuals. And finally, the tax penalties for the uninsured, the individual mandate, has been eliminated.

The good news is that if you are eligible for a Health Savings Account, the amounts you can contribute would increase in 2018. Of course, this is something that will truly benefit the poor by providing a meaningful purpose for all of their discretionary income. The Speaker has said he wants a "quality, affordable, accessible healthcare plan".

Interestingly, healthcare has always been accessible if you could afford it. And generally speaking has been a quality product. The only issue has always been, who pays for it?

According to the Republican Party, the failure of Obamacare was demonstrated by excessive increases in insurance premiums and the departure of insurance companies from many markets, leaving people with little or no choice in plans. When Republicans succeeded in delaying the implementation of the individual mandate, the only people who bought insurance were those who were sick and needed it. Young healthy adults who didn't already have insurance largely stayed away. And as costs rose so did premiums. No healthcare plan, not Obamacare or the American Healthcare Act, can provide accessible, affordable, quality health insurance unless people who do not need insurance participate in the program. Insurance is based on shared risk and shared cost. If only those at high risk are sharing the cost, it is going to be high. That is the undisputed business model.

Unless we deny care to those without coverage who need it, and we hope this will never happen, those who are relatively healthy and deem the cost too high will not participate in the program, no matter what it is called. The only way to provide quality, accessible healthcare at an affordable price is for everyone to participate in the program. As long as we have millions of people without "insurance", the cost of their care, when it is necessary, will ultimately borne by those of us who do have coverage.
