Why Pima County Needs a Sales Tax

Next week the Board of Supervisors will begin discussion of a resolution to implement a half penny sales tax to fund the repair of roads in Pima County. A unanimous vote by the board will be required to pass this resolution. To understand the need for this tax, it is important to understand how road repairs are funded. A portion of the Vehicle License Tax (VLT) and all of the allocated HURF funds support the Pima County Department of Transportation. Currently this amounts to approximately \$56 million per year. Of this, about \$19 million is for debt service on the 1997 HURF Bonds and \$15 million runs the DOT. That leaves about \$22 million to repair county roads. Current estimates to bring all county roads up to at least fair condition range from \$500 million to \$1 billion. It doesn't take much to see that current funding is inadequate to get the job done.


This doesn't include the cost of ongoing maintenance of traffic lights and signs, guardrails and road striping, all of which are critical for the safety of Pima County residents. District 1 (Oro Valley) Supervisor, Ally Miller contends that we do not need the revenue, that we just need to prioritize our spending. She frequently cites the monies being spent on soccer fields and the Kino Sports Complex which are restricted and can only be used for the specific purpose for which they are intended, so, unavailable for road repair anyway. Granted, we can find some financial savings in the county's \$1.3 billion budget but no where near what it will take to improve Pima County roads.

Please contact Supervisor Miller and tell her to support a half penny sales tax to be used exclusively to repair county roads and to repeal the twenty-five cent property tax levied for the same purpose. Her number is 520-724-2738.
